

**MINUTES OF A MEETING OF THE FRESHWATER PARISH COUNCIL HELD ON
TUESDAY 1st JUNE 2010 AT 7.10 PM IN THE COUNCIL CHAMBER**

1. APOLOGIES: Cllrs: G Kennett

2. TO INVITE CLLRS TO DECLARE AN INTEREST IN MATTERS ON THE AGENDA:

MALCO committee members (Cllrs Ottway, Hobbs, Fleury, Hinton and England) declared an interest in item 12 on the Agenda.

3. MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETING:

It was resolved the Minutes of the previous meeting held 4th May 2010, having been circulated and read, be approved and signed (PE/CF).

Cllr England pointed out that with regard to the Hooke Memorial the Minutes were correct but the WW Beacon report was incorrect as the word 'proposed' was not included.

Local Archive Group – Cllr Hinton reported he had spoken to the County Librarian who confirmed this group were not tied in with the IW Council and records would not be transferred to the County Records Office. The County Librarian had been upset that the address used on the Archive Group letter had been Freshwater Library.

4. ENVIRONMENT AND NEIGHBOURHOOD OFFICERS REPORT: Tabled, noted and will be put on the PC website.

Speed Checks – ENO reported these had been undertaken recently, including Queens Road (as mentioned under Correspondence). Out of 100 cars checked in Queens Road, 5 were found to be speeding and of 40 in Copse Lane just 1, which he felt was encouraging. He said that Cllrs were welcome to go along with Police when they undertake speed checks.

Cllr Hinton pointed out that a 20 mph sign outside an East Cowes school was active for too long after the school closing time. Cllr Cameron agreed to ask these to be checked locally as they too may need adjusting.

Spinfish Clearance – As Open Spaces Chairman, Cllr Bray agreed to discuss this with the ENO.

Cllrs agreed a letter be sent to the Probation Service thanking them for their good work.

Community Forum – Noted the next one was on 25th June 2010 at 7 pm. Cllr Cameron suggested that the public be asked what they feel Probation Services could do for them at this meeting and said it would be good if someone from Probation could attend this meeting.

Seat – ENO trying to acquire one for the Parish – Cllr Hobbs reminded Cllrs that IWC had agreed one could go on the grass area at Westhill on the way to Fort Victoria. Suggestion of by the bus stop in Heathfield Road also made.

Gunfire – Cllr Harris had reported he had heard this, (including machine gun fire and parachute flares) to 101 who knew nothing and asked Clerk if she had any information. Clerk was not aware and emailed Police and ENO. ENO confirmed it had been a Marine exercise in The Solent although the Police had not been notified beforehand.

5. QUESTIONS ON THE AGENDA, FROM MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC: None.

6. CLERK'S REPORT:

Planetway – Invites to Shalfleet, Yarmouth and Totland to meeting on 15th June 2010 at 6.45 pm have been sent. Clerk confirmed with Mr Rapley (as well as thanking him for attending the last meeting) and asked him for more information so it can be sent out prior to the meeting.

Totland PC have agreed their Chairman attending.

Cllrs noted the Clerk away the week commencing 14th June 2010 and Assistant Clerk will therefore service this meeting.

Freshwater Cricket Club – Letter sent to School Re-organisation Project Director as agreed at last meeting with copy sent to Mr Gosden. No reply received at time of writing report.

Mini Motor Bike – Request for land gone in June Beacon and was in IW County Press.

RCC Community Support – Reminder – representative attending the July meeting.

Brookside Road pathway – ENO said he had spoken to the Highway Superintendent who had done a land search and claimed PC own this land. Clerk confirmed they did but it was the responsibility for the pathway that was in question. Cllr Wheeler agreed to look at the pathway after the meeting and phone the Clerk tomorrow to discuss suggestions on a way forward.

Moa Place Car Park – Discussion on lack of pedestrian walkways through the car park i.e. from bottom to top car parks and from the Health Centre path down to Brookside Road. Cllr Cameron agreed to speak to IWC on this matter.

Colwell Road – Letter to Highways sent and Mr Dunn notified. Reply from Highways read (they have also contacted Mr Dunn directly to explain position) – no budget allocated for speed indicator activated signs, (which can be programmed and collect data) in this financial year. It was noted there are now two 30 mph warning signs installed in Colwell Road.

Horse Riding – After some investigation Clerk found name of two riders seen riding where they should not – passed to Chairman.

Apple Game – Repaired and replaced on Stroud Recreation Ground.

Police – PCSO Fern Wherry came to Parish Office and met Clerk and Assistant Clerk.

MUGA – Clerk been in contact with IWC Officer who had been asked by IWC to look into and make his recommendations – he agreed to let PC have a copy of these.

Village Design Statement – Sent out as agreed at last meeting.

Japanese Knotweed – Clerk contacted Groundsells and they agreed to go and look at and email a quote to Clerk. Received quoted for £80 – Clerk agreed go ahead as under her delegated powers. Cllrs noted work had been undertaken, Cllr Bray proposed account be paid, seconded Cllr Hobbs - **resolved**.

Stream Drains – Clerk contacted Environment Agency and asked them to clear access pipes into The Brook.

Clerk met with Open Space Chairman and subsequently arranged for a meeting with Stream Clearance Contractor.

Norton Green - Skip/Van – Cllrs Sutton and Cameron had agreed to speak to property owner. Cllr Sutton reported they had not had chance. Cllr Wheeler suggested he deal with this matter as he lives in Norton Green. Cllr Sutton said the owner of the property involved did not live in Norton Green and Cllr Cameron and himself would see him.

Pound Green – Annual letters prepared and delivered by Cllr Cameron.

He asked for one to be sent to Mr and Mrs Wells, as although they do not require access to their garage over Pound Green, he believed a visitor of theirs had been parked on the Green when he delivered the letters.

Cllr Cameron had agreed to meet Highways representative to look at access/position of posts to prevent parking on the Green. He said Mr Burton, IWC Officer was coming out to Freshwater and Totland and he had given him a list of areas to look at including Afton Road by T junction as well as Pound Green.

Resident of Pound Green reported to Clerk potholes at far side of Pound really bad – Cllr Cameron had agreed to look at these and report back to PC.

It was noted that old road chippings could not be put down anymore as they could be contaminated.

Norton Green – No reply received to letters sent to two property owners asking them to cut back their hedges. Cllr Wheeler said one of the properties was now on the market.

Memorial Seats:

1) Freshwater Bay seat hit by traffic, bits removed by IWC and Clerk liaised with local resident and FBRA who are looking at putting in a replacement.

2) **Seats** – ENO has copy of map with PC seats marked on and has arranged for Probation Service to refurbish the PC seats. Assistant Clerk arranged that Totland PC will be billed for paint through their account with Johnstones and Freshwater PC repay them. Cost £335 plus VAT – all agreed.

Land in Brookside Road by Wesley Hall – Day after Open Spaces meeting - Clerk gained advice from solicitor regarding the wording in PC reply to Methodist Church Solicitor, (which was then agreed by Open Spaces Chairman) PC made extensive investigations over many years and they have not been able to establish beyond doubt that the PC owns this land.

Letter from PC Solicitor thanked Clerk for letting him have copy of letter to Methodist Church Solicitor and states he fully appreciates that the PC have decided to take no further action. Enclosed his account.

Skate Park – Clerk had liaised with Cllr Fleury and others – ordered CCTV camera and associated equipment and laptop.

Archives – Clerk spoken to PC archivist who was pleased to hear of PC suggestion to have an archive open day – suggested it could be for Annual Parish Meeting.

Spinfish – Open Space Chairman reported Probation Service had cleared overgrown areas and quartered the ditch. Feel letter of thanks and some recognition needed.

FYT Bus – Letter sent to Yarmouth TC (as agreed at last Planning meeting) inviting them to elect a representative to the Joint Steering Committee.

15th June 2010 Meeting – To include Planning, Finance and Planetway.

Concert Band – Clerk reported a very enjoyable afternoon had been had by all who attended – 50. Band were excellent – Clerk has asked for photos.

Donations towards Band and West Wight Middle School - £160 – Chairman had agreed half of the donation money go towards the cost of the Band (£200) and half to WWMS – all agreed.

SLCC (Society of Local Council Clerks) Membership – Clerk asked to look into, and confirmed that the annual membership paid for this year is a personal membership, not a Council membership. If Cllrs wished to pay for Assistant Clerk’s membership it would be another £149 or Clerk can cascade relevant information. All agreed Clerk do this and not pay another membership.

8. REFURBISHMENT OF SKATE PARK:

Cllr Fleury updated Cllrs on the project to date. The contractor had built the metal frames for the new equipment and it had gone off the Island for galvanising. All other materials are held by the contractor and will be brought to the Skate Park in due course.

Work will start on site Monday 7th June, completing Friday 11th June 2010 when the Skate Park will be closed. This will be followed by an inspection.

Joint Skate Park Committee received approval from Freshwater and Totland PCs to expend monies on the development of the Skate Park, the ordering of the CCTV and other associated costs.

The Clerk contacted the Parish Council insurance brokers who confirmed premium for extras relating to the Skate Park would not be more than £100.

Open Competition Day to be held on Saturday 19th June 2010 at 11 am hosted by Wight Trash.

On 25th May 2010 Cllr Fleury and ENO attended a bid application to the PTCG funding Panel and gave a presentation. Informed verbally bid was unsuccessful and await a letter giving reasons. Noted West Wight Carnival had also been unsuccessful in their bid.

Clerk had made closure signs for Skate Park.

a) To Resolve to purchase laptop and software in conjunction with CCTV at a cost of £740:

Cllr Harris proposed this be purchased, seconded Cllr Wheeler, 1 against. **Resolved**, on majority vote that the laptop and software be purchased. Noted this is from the funding obtained for the Skate Park.

b) To Resolve to purchase CCTV system training, configuration and commissioning = £450:

Cllr Lillywhite proposed this be purchased, seconded Cllr Bray, 1 against. **Resolved**, on majority vote.

9. TO AGREE MINUTES OF OPEN SPACES MEETING HELD 20TH APRIL 2010:

Cllr Bray proposed these be agreed, seconded Cllr Fleury – **resolved**.

10. TO AGREE MINUTES OF ALLOTMENTS MEETING HELD 20TH APRIL 2010:

Cllr Wheeler pointed out he was present at this meeting – Clerk apologised and Minute were amended.

Cllr Bray proposed these be agreed, seconded Cllr Fleury – **resolved**.

11. TO CONSIDER REQUEST FROM PS LYTH TO GIVE A DONATION TOWARDS WEST WIGHT MIDDLE SCHOOL ‘REWARDS DAY’:

Clerk confirmed the Chairman had already agreed half of the collection from the Concert Band go towards to this (£80) – **resolved**.

When asked, Clerk confirmed that PC gave £100 last year to UKSA trip and £625 remaining in donation pot, only spent £75 last month.

Donations were looked at by the PC in May and November. The request from PS Lyth had come in the day of the May meeting but not in time for the Clerk to have it for the meeting. The Chairman had agreed it could therefore go on this Agenda.

Cllr Sutton said this was not in the Standing Orders and voted against the PC making a donation not in the May and November meetings.

Cllr Hobbs proposed £100 be given, seconded Cllr Wheeler – **resolved** on majority vote.

12. TO CONSIDER WHETHER TO AGREE AND SIGN THE LEASE/LICENCE FOR THE FRESHWATER PARISH OFFICE FROM THE MEMORIAL HALL ARTS & LEISURE COMPANY:

No reply to letter addressed to Cllr Ottway as Chairman of this company, dated 22nd April 2010, had been received.

Cllrs on the MALC committee confirmed this had not been on the Agenda of the last MALCO meeting.

Cllr Ottway reported she had resigned as Chairman of MALCO, Cllr Carol Bryan of Totland PC was the new Chair and Cllr Hinton Vice Chair.

Cllr Hinton proposed Clerk send another copy of the letter to the Memorial Hall Committee and to ask the Administrator make sure it goes on the next Agenda for meeting on 23rd June 2010, stating this matter is now urgent – **resolved**.

Cllr Ottway asked that when Clerk write, she remind Memorial Hall to let PC have copies of Minutes.

Agreed item go on PC July Agenda.

13. TO ELECT FCI MEMBER:

Cllr Hobbs proposed Cllr Bray as the second PC member of FCI, seconded Cllr Harris.

Cllr Bray agreed.

14. SCHOOL GREEN – WHERE DO THE PARISH COUNCIL GO FROM HERE TO IMPROVE THIS AREA:

The email received and forwarded in April, from Cllr Kennett via Sue Poston, had been re-circulated to Cllrs.

It was noted that ‘charette’ was French for brainstorming.

Cllr Ottway explained that the WWLP were prepared to work together with the Parish Council and Joseph Kohlmaier of the IW Architecture Centre, to look at School Green.

It was noted the Safe Route to School and new bridge would be incorporated into the plans as well as the MUGA, Skate Park, Youth Centre, Pavilion and Hooke Memorial.

Cllr Ottway said Cllr Kennett had asked the architect to come and meet with a sub-committee of the PC (to be formed) to take this project forward.

The public needed to be asked what they wanted and Cllr Cameron suggested they be asked this at the Community Forum meeting 25th of this month.

Cllr Hobbs confirmed the Parish Council had already named the stream which runs through the village ‘ The Brook’ and School Green had been called that since the 1900’s. Cllr Ottway said they were not looking at changing the name but at the history of the area.

Question asked if the architect would charge – Cllr Ottway said he was prepared to give his services and the only cost to PC would be Cllrs time.

Cllr Bray asked if there was any guarantee the plans would come to fruition and Cllr Harris felt the process was flawed – a great deal of time and effort could be put in and then no grant be secured. Public would then feel it had been a waste of time – in commercial business he said, money sought first, then consultation take place.

Cllr Ottway said Heritage Lottery lay down the rules for grants, if WWLP do anything wrong they cannot get the grant. Cannot give money left right and centre and are being prudent and it helped if those who submitted funding bids worked with WWLP Officers. It was noted Cllr Harris had done this in the School Green ditch culverting bid he submitted to WWLP but it had still been unsuccessful.

Discussion on wording of Memo on project – Cllr Hinton said he felt the proposals would be taking power away from PC and giving it to the ‘experts’. Cllr Harris said he understood the need for an overall view but was puzzled that the WWLP did not think the PC a fair representation of the community and queried the need for them to get involved until the money available.

Discussion on WWLP generally and ditch in School Green.

Cllr Sutton proposed the PC had lost confidence in WWLP, seconded Cllr Lillywhite; vote taken 4 For, 8 Abstained.

After further discussion Cllr Ottway asked the PC if they wished to form a small group to take the project further. Cllr Hinton said he would like the ENO to be part of the group – all agreed.

Resolved: Cllrs Lillywhite, England, Ottway /Kennett, Davidson, Wheeler, Bray, Hobbs and ENO be the PC sub-committee and asked Cllr Ottway to arrange a meeting as soon as possible.

It was noted that as Cllr Ottway sat on the WWLP Funding Panel Cllr Kennett would have to take the vote.

15. SAFE ROUTE TO SCHOOL: Cllrs noted this would be look at with the School Green Plans.

16. GRANNY’S MEADE: TO AGREE PLAN DRAWN UP BY OPEN SPACES CHAIRMAN: Letter from Mrs Jo Martin read concerning dogs on Granny’s Meade. She had discussed this with the ENO who had agreed an official signboard was needed. – all agreed there was no Dog Control Order in place on Granny’s Meade but PC would look into signage for the Tree Heaven Memorial Area when they finalise the plans for Granny’s Meade. Clerk will inform.

Information circulated to Cllrs and presentation given by Cllr Bray. Cllr Bray said her plan looked at gently adding to Granny’s Meade over the next year or two. Including to harrow and plant wild seed this Autumn (one quote £1,600), to keep the area natural and inviting and encourage people to take a pride in it, bearing in mind it had a public footpath running through it. She felt to achieve this the area only needed ‘tweaking’. She suggested the entrances, and a scruffy area on Camp Road side, needed tidying, hedging planted and general maintenance, such is taking place at present, be retained.

It was noted the natural ‘track’ was one formed by walkers. She asked that in future when memorial trees are planted the PC agree that people stop putting ‘gardens’ round them – all agreed. Other plans were outlined such as creating a thicket and planting of some native fruit and nut trees to attract birds and bees.

Cllr Hinton said he thought it was a brilliant idea and proposed PC go ahead with Cllr Bray’s plan for Granny’s Meade.

The Clerk informed Cllrs that the FVA Wildlife Group were currently working on a Management Plan and costings. Both would be finalised by end of June.

They had asked if there was a PC meeting they could attend before putting in a grant application. Clerk had suggested the 6th July 2010 meeting. Cllr Bray said they had arranged for soil analysis to be undertaken.

Cllr Bale expressed concern over the accessibility to chairs and felt maximum grants may be given if area made more accessible and suggested swing gates could be installed at both ends.

Cllr Davidson said the Ramblers Association had a project ‘Donate a Gate’ and gave details and it was agreed these be looked into.

It was suggested Cllr Bray speak to Alison Finch of the FVA Wildlife Group and a small working group could be formed.

Cllr Hinton again proposed PC go with Cllr Bray's plan, seconded Cllr Sutton. Cllr Bray said PC do then have control. Cllr Sutton agreed and said Cllr Bray had put a lot of work in and her vision for the area and plans were good and which he supported. Vote taken on proposal: 3 For, 9 against, 1 abstained.

Cllr Ottway said out of courtesy the PC should listen to the FVA Wildlife group plans. Cllr Harris agreed and queried if Cllr Bray could meet up with them before they attend a PC meeting. Cllr Hobbs agreed and suggested PC wait to make final decision until after they have put their plans forward.

Some Cllrs felt PC should go with Cllr Brays plans subject to a compelling case being submitted by the FVA.

Cllr England made an amendment, to the motion made by Cllr Hinton and seconded by Cllr Sutton, that PC hold it over until after July meeting.

Cllr Wheeler said he felt FVA had put forward proposals for Granny's Meade and they deserved to be heard although he was with Cllr Bray's plans.

Cllr Bale proposed in view of what had been said, that Cllr Bray as Chairman of Open Spaces and himself as Vice Chair, make contact with the FVA group before they attend the July meeting and PC endeavour to work with them, seconded Cllr Wheeler; vote taken: 12 For, 1 Against.

17. NORTON GREEN – TO DISCUSS MEASURE TO TAKE TO PREVENT EROSION OF THE GREEN AND QUOTATIONS RECEIVED FOR POSTS AND BOULDERS:

Clerk confirmed quotations had been received from Brighstone Landscapes for installing posts and boulders.

Cllr Wheeler said following the letters he had delivered to Norton Green residents he had received some feedback and was in the process of forming an informal residents association. He was happy to pursue and all agreed a decision be left on preventative measures for now. Clerk will inform contractor.

18. BLACK HUT GREEN – TO RATIFY OPEN SPACE CHAIRMAN DECISION FOLLOWING SITE MEETING WITH CLERK AND QUOTATIONS FROM CONTRACTOR:

Cllrs noted this contractor was the same one who had recently installed the other posts at Black Hut Green.

Clerk had met him on site and subsequently the Open Space Chairman on site.

Quotation as follows:

To dismantle section of bow top fencing, gun out concrete posts and move to the correct line, reinstate, setting posts in new concrete foundation = £300 + VAT.

Supply and install 5 x 100mm x 100 mm pressure treated posts (as previous) - £115. + VAT.

Cllr Fleury proposed PC agreed quotation to move the existing bow top fencing to the correct line and install 5 posts, seconded Cllr Lillywhite – **resolved**.

19. TO AGREE FRESHWATER PARISH COUNCIL ACCOUNTS FOR YEAR ENDING 31ST MARCH 2010:

Completed by accountant and copies circulated to Cllrs.

Cllr Fleury asked why parishioners were paying out for the MUGA – he felt IWC should pay this money back.

Cllr Cameron said he had emailed Simon Dear this morning regarding the MUGA and the Development Officer post and been told he was on holiday. Informed Director who is his line manager will be arranging a meeting to try to sort matters. Cllr Fleury asked if he could attend.

Cllr Lillywhite proposed accounts be agreed, accepted and signed, seconded Cllr Fleury – vote taken – Majority For (2 abstained). Accounts signed by Chairman and Clerk.

20. REPORTS FROM SUB-GROUPS, COMMITTEES AND REPRESENTATIVES OF COMMITTEES:

Footpaths – Cllr Davidson reported it was F66 not F67 that horses had been riding down. The Clerk confirmed she had obtained the names of two horse riders who were riding where they should not and passed these to the Chairman.

Military Road – Cllr Hinton said there was a meeting to discuss this tomorrow. Cllrs noted Cllr Fleury was attending. Cllr Hinton urged that for the economy of the West Wight this road be kept open. He said it was crucial and the West Wight would be the most affected if it closed.

FYT Bus – Recent report tabled. When Cllr Ottway asked about a Business Plan, Cllr Harris confirmed this will be put forward at the Public Meeting to be held on 26th June 2010 at the Memorial Hall at 10.30 a.m. Further Public Meetings in Totland, Thorley and Yarmouth were being held the following week.

21. CORRESPONDENCE:

Code of Conduct Training – Details received of training to be delivered by the IWC Monitoring Officer on Wednesday, 30th June 2010 at Memorial Hall, Freshwater at 2 pm.

Important training for all Parish Councillors. Clerk went round the table asking for names.

Cllrs Bray, Hobbs, England, Hinton and Davidson agreed to attend and Cllrs Lillywhite and Harris said they hoped to – Clerk agreed to put forward all.

Cllr Sutton said he had heard the Standards Board for England was to be defunct in the near future so would not be attending. He believed this would impact on PC Code of Conduct.

Queens Road Speeding – further to contact by local resident, Clerk contacted IWC Highways department who replied they would be monitoring a selection of sites where 20 mph limits have been implemented, Queens Road to be included.

PC informed that unfortunately they have an exceptionally high level of monitoring to do at the moment with only limited number of machines.

Clerk to inform resident that speed checks had been undertaken by the Police recently.

Closure of Freshwater Bay Post Office – Cllrs had expressed concern over the proposed closure.

Cllr Cameron reported that in the last few days he had heard that planning permission had been given for the land behind the shop and the shop was not now being sold but being repaired. Also heard that Mr Filby, Totland Post Office Manager would be running the Freshwater Bay Post Office. Cllrs agreed letter of support be sent.

Benches at Pound Green – Email received from Pound Green resident commenting on how nice the benches look after their Spring Clean. Said Pound Green is looking very smart, the neat and tidy grass cutting makes such a difference to the residents and visitors. Thanks to Clerk and Cllrs.

Freshwater Bay Conservation Area – Email received 7th May 2010 confirming that on 27th April 2010 the decision was taken to confirm the Articles 4(2) Direction is to remain in force. The Official Notice to go in IW County Press and letters sent to owner/occupiers. A copy of the Direction is available to view at the Council Offices at Seaclose or on the IWC website.

Email from Police – Community Forum Meeting to be held at the Memorial Hall, Freshwater on 25th June 2010 starting at approximately 7 pm.

RCC Survey Form to be completed – passed to Cllr Hobbs.

TPO – Notice that IWC making an Order on tree at 1 Diamond Cottages, Norton Green Freshwater. Will let PC know decision.

Youth Talent Contest – Notice received today the committee of the Memorial Hall will be running this on 1st August 2010. Closing date for application 29th July 2010. Details given.

Youth Reorganisation – series of localities and stakeholder conversations and briefings arranged to gather views and comments (details given) – Cllrs note there was one arranged to be held at West Wight Youth Centre – Wednesday 30th June 2010 6 – 7.30 pm

Yarmouth Coastal Defence Working Group – Would like to invite 3 member of Freshwater PC to attend a briefing session on Tuesday 20th July 2010 at 10 am in the Harbour Office. This is in addition to existing member of the Working Group - Mr David Lewis. Report to be sent out prior to the meeting. Cllrs Hobbs, Bray and Lillywhite agreed to attend with Cllr Davidson as reserve.

22. CHAIRMANS REPORT: None.

23. QUESTION FROM CLLRS:
